
Principal's Message

This fortnight, we have had two incidences that are not nice to report. On the weekend of the 10th-11th February, someone entered the school grounds and vandalised one of the toilets, as well as interfered with other school property. We take incidences such as this very seriously. The school is happy for people to enter school grounds, out of hours with a few considerations. Children, under 18 must be supervised by an adult and any person on site must treat the school and property with care. Any breach of this must be reported.

The second incident occurred on Tuesday afternoon, 20th February. A student was riding his bike along Prince Street and has reported he saw a white ute following him. Please have a conversation with your child about their safety. At school students are taught the 3R's, Recognise, Report and React. Recognise danger, react by running and calling loudly, then report anything to someone they trust. Congratulations to that student for following this important procedure. 


School banking
