


P&C AGM

Responding to Disrespectful Behaviour

The Federal Government is urging schools to take action against bullying. They have released a new program that will be delivered through the Healthy Harold platform later in the year. Relate, Respect, Connect is an anti-bullying program teaching children how to develop healthy relationships with their peers. Parents and carers play an important role in their child's learning and development. I have included a tip sheet giving parents and carers ideas when responding to disrespectful behaviours. You can help your child understand the differences between respectful and disrespectful behaviours by encouraging them to behave respectfully towards others. Please read the flyer and have a conversation about how to treat others, with your children.

Let your children know that:

- you strongly disapprove of any type of disrespectful behaviour and you expect them to treat other people with respect
- it is their right to be treated with respect and feel safe and comfortable at school and when they are engaging in other activities they should expect other people to treat them respectfully.

Model the use of respectful communication in your family and discourage your children from behaving towards or speaking to other family members in disrespectful ways.

CCS will deliver upgraded and reliable wireless access in all our learning spaces, assisting teachers to deliver future focused learning to prepare our students for digital age jobs.


Improved wireless and internet services will also give students more chances to connect and collaborate and greater access to online knowledge databases, streaming media, educational institutions and experts.

We are working with our Technical Officer to ensure that disruptions during the installation are kept to a minimum.

Tell Them from Me Survey


