Principals' Message

The school is partaking in a whole school approach to Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL). Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is an educational process that brings together the whole-school community to contribute to developing a positive, safe and supportive learning culture. The PBL framework assists schools to improve social, emotional, behavioural and academic outcomes for children and young people.

PBL is a process, not a program.

When PBL is implemented well, teachers and students have more time to focus on relationships and classroom instruction.

Students and staff benefit from:

- reduced problem behaviour
- increased time focused on instruction
- improved social-emotional wellbeing
- positive and respectful relationships among students and staff
- better support for teachers to teach, model and respond effectively to student needs
- a predictable learning environment where staff and students know what is expected to deliver effective practices that can be sustained over time.

Staff have commenced initiating this program and parent/carer and community input will be sought in the coming months.

If you have any questions about, or would like to discuss your child's learning - please make an appointment to speak to your childs' classroom teacher at the front office. We are more than happy to have these conversations.

Tell them from me

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them From Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 9 March and 8 May. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.


School Uniform

Harmony Day

Our diversity makes Australia a great place to live. Harmony Day is a celebration of our cultural diversity – a day of cultural respect for everyone who calls Australia home. Stem Share VR Systems

This term the students have had the opportunity to experience Virtual Reality Headsets through the Departments Stem Share Project. We have had some technology hiccups along the way, however the students have been very patient with this and with the teachers learning about this new technology as well. Students have been able to have such experiences as visiting other countries, exploring the depths of the ocean as well as a range of World War Tours. These experiences add to the learning of the students in a way that is engaging and informative. The kit unfortunately will need to be returned but we are able to book it again later in the term.











Tie-Dyed Art

In Art the students have been studying the art of tyedying fabric. The students researched and watched videos on how to section fabric and bind it tightly with thread or rubber bands in order for the fabric to resist the dye solution. The way in which you section off the fabric and tie it determines the pattern that is created once the dying process has been completed. The students then trialled the technique on their Library bags. The results were amazing.



















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Learning in the Junior Room

The students have been working very hard in the Junior Room. There has been lots of fine motor activities such as making playdough into the letter of the day, their name and the numbers they are learning. They have been sorting Numbers 1-10 in order and using animal counters to work on one to one counting. As well as completing some amazing reading and writing activities. Well done and keep up the great work!
