Adopt a Farmer Day

The Department of Education is supporting the 'Adopt A Farmer' initiative to be held across the nation on Wednesday 8 May 2019 (Week 2, Term 2).

As you are no doubt aware, farming communities are doing it tough with crippling drought in NSW and Victoria and both drought and flooding rains in Queensland. We have all been touched by the tough conditions farmers, their families, their animals and communities are experiencing.

Continuing this good work, there is an ambitious goal – to have a gold coin mufti day drive on Wednesday May 8 2019, to raise \$800,000 nationally. All proceeds will go to farmers.

Registered charity, Rural Aid will collect the funds. The charity had huge success with the Buy a Bale campaign, which has distributed over \$10 million worth of fodder to farmers around Australia. Rural Aid will put \$100 on 8,000 Visa gift cards and mail them to the farmers already registered with them. The recipients can spend the cash in their local communities. It isn't just farmers struggling but town cafes, barbers and other shops in desperate need of a cash injection to help support jobs and services.

Students are invited to wear mufti to school on Wednesday 8th May and bring along a gold coin. The school will also host a cake stall on the day for students to purchase items for 50cents.

Book Club

The 91st Bonalbo Show will be held on **Friday 3 and Saturday 4 May 2019** at Bonalbo Showgrounds. The students have entered a variety of artwork and cooking items this year. On Saturday the Kids Bouncy Rodeo will be performing 4 shows across the day, and the rodeo will be available for kids to play on between shows. There is also a showcasing of a range of horse events; elsewhere on the grounds is a Pen Cattle competition, Led Cattle Judging, a Poultry competition, Heavy Horse competition and a Dogs NSW judging event.
